

**Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute
Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing Partnership
with Gardner-Webb University**

The Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute (CCC&TI) Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing Partnership with Gardner-Webb University provides a seamless ADN-to-MSN pathway for CCC&TI nursing students. Students who are accepted into CCC&TI's ADN program are dually accepted into the Davis RN-to-BSN program in the Hunt School of Nursing at Gardner-Webb with a seamless pathway to the Master of Science in Nursing (Education/Administration).

By collaborative agreement between CCC&TI and Gardner-Webb University, CCC&TI students in the ADN program are automatically accepted into the Hunt School of Nursing's Davis RN-BSN program, conditional upon the following:

- Minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Students with 64 or more college credit hours will only have their last 64 hours of GPA calculated for admissions. Students with less than 64 will have their cumulative GPA evaluated for admission,
- Immunizations required by the University,
- Satisfactory Criminal Background Check,
- Holding an unrestricted nursing license, and
- Request a final, official transcript be sent from all prior colleges to Gardner-Webb University Degree Completion Program, P.O. Box 1896, Boiling Springs, NC 28017.

Upon receipt of these documents, an enrollment representative from Gardner-Webb will contact the student to assist with registration for classes.

Upon successful completion of the Davis RN-to-BSN program and meeting the following requirements, students will be seamlessly enrolled in the MSN (Education/Administration).

- GPA of 2.70 on all undergraduate work OR GPA of 2.7 for last 64 hours of undergraduate or graduate work Completion of (1) NURS 500 *Theoretical Basis for Advanced Practice*; (2) NURS 501 *Nursing and Healthcare Systems and Issues*; and (3) Statistics class, and
- Maintaining good academic standing in the Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing program
- Receipt of three graduate letters of reference.

Note: Students who delay enrollment beyond one year must submit a new application to the MSN program for consideration.

1. A student can receive transfer credit for courses according to the list of equivalencies set forth within the attached Transfer Plan. To receive credit for a course, a student must have earned a "C" (2.0) or better in that course. Other courses taken will be evaluated for transfer on a course-by-course basis by Gardner-Webb University's Registrar Services.
2. Up to 96 transfer hours could be awarded for RN-to-BSN transfer students. For a bachelor's degree, the final 32 credit hours for graduation must be taken at Gardner-Webb.
3. Transfer hours and program requirements may vary and are dependent upon the individual student's transfer work.
4. Students must complete 64 credit hours at GWU to be eligible for graduation honors.
5. Under the terms of the Caldwell Community College & Technical Institute Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing Partnership with Gardner-Webb University, qualifying CCC&TI students are accepted seamlessly into the RN-to-BSN and MSN at Gardner-Webb upon acceptance into CCC&TI's ADN.

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Agreement made [July 9, 2020] between Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute and Gardner-Webb University. This agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis.

Admissions Procedures

- To be considered for acceptance into the bridge program, CCC&TI ADN students submit in writing to the Director of Nursing their consent for CCC&TI to share the student's application/admission documents with GWU. Upon receipt of these documents, an enrollment representative from GWU will contact the student to assist with registration for classes.
- Students admitted to the Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing must meet admission requirements of the Associate Degree in Nursing at CCC&TI and Gardner-Webb University.
- Gardner-Webb University's Enrollment Management Office and Registrar Services will accept CCC&TI official application/admission documents as official copies of Gardner-Webb University application/admission documents for the purpose of entering applicant data into the Gardner-Webb University student data systems as a dually admitted Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing student in both the CCC&TI ADN and Gardner-Webb University.
- Gardner-Webb University will only process the applications of admitted applicants into the CCC&TI ADN program into the Gardner-Webb University student data systems after they have been accepted to the ADN.
- There is no application fee to Gardner-Webb University for Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing students.
- All documents will be processed through the CCC&TI Registrar's Office and official copies provided to Gardner-Webb University's Enrollment Management Office.
- Each enrolling Gardner-Webb University student must have an immunization record on file at Gardner-Webb University (as required by law) before registration. Gardner-Webb University reserves the right to cancel admission offers to students who do not provide full documentation or meet the requirements for acceptance by the stated deadline.






Academic Procedures

- On the ADN-to-MSN pathway, CCC&TI will serve as the home institution for students' enrollment until they have completed their ADN, and Gardner-Webb University will serve as the home institution for students who have completed their ADN and enrolled in the Davis RN-to-BSN.
- Dual admission and continued enrollment for each school will be ensured for Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing students each year by maintaining full-time status at the home institution as designated above.





- Students accepted into the Bridge to Professional Advancement in Nursing must meet the academic and professional requirements for eligibility to continue in the home institution as designated above.
