NOTE: HIST 101, HIST 102, HIST 245, POLS 202, PSYC 201, SSCI 205, ECON 203, COMM 230, and BIOL 104, GEOL 105, or GEOL 106 can be counted for both General Education requirements and relevant major requirements; **Students must complete ONE 300-level and ONE 400-level Writing Intensive course.**

*NOTE: Should be taken sophomore year prior to taking any 300-level or 400-level course.

**NOTE: May only be used in one category.

***NOTE: Students will not be permitted to complete more than 50% of the Professional Education minor (excluding student teaching) until they are formally admitted to the Teacher Education Program. All candidates must be fully admitted into the Teacher Education Program a minimum of two full semesters prior to the semester in which they student teach. Ideally, students should interview no later than the end of the first semester of the junior year. Once admitted, students must maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher. SEE CATALOG for more information.
