Professional Readiness Experience

__ Successful completion of a Professional Readiness Experience (PRE) is a graduation requirement for students.

Notes:

1. Some students, based on test scores, must take CRLT 101 and/or MATH 100 as a prerequisite for courses in the General Education curriculum.
2. Students must complete a foreign language through the first semester of the intermediate level (201), unless the student meets an exception detailed in the Academic Catalog.
3. Each student will be enrolled for a Dimensions course each semester of full-time enrollment or until a minimum of two semester hours of credit (4 semesters) has been earned. Each Dimensions course earns one-half credit hour each term.
4. ENGL 101 and 102 are Tier One Writing Intensive (WI) courses. An additional Tier Two WI course must be selected from the general education requirements. Two Tier III courses will be taken in the major.
