Academic Guidelines

- 1. Entrance requirements to the Bachelor program include official transcripts from accredited institutions showing a GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale and 24 transferable credits.
- 2. A student can receive transfer credit for courses according to this list of equivalencies set forth within the attached Transfer Plan. To receive credit for a course, a student must have earned a "C" 2.0 or better in that course. Other courses taken will be evaluated for transfer on a course by course basis by the Gardner-Webb University Registrar Services.
- 3. Students who do not have transfer credit for ENG 101, will need to register for this course during their first semester.
- 4. LIB 305 must be successfully completed.
- 5. Grades of "C" (2.0) or higher are required on all major courses. A "C minus" or lower will not meet graduation requirements and the course will need to be repeated at GWU.
- 6. A minimum grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale is required for graduation on all course work attempted at GWU (see institution GPA).
- 7. Students transferring from accredited two-year institutions may transfer up to 60 credit hours. Students transferring from accredited four-year institutions may transfer up to 90 credit hours. Students transferring from a combination of two- and four-year institutions may transfer a maximum of 90 credit hours with no more than 60 of the 90 hours coming from two-year institutions. All transfer students must complete at least the final 30 credit hours with Gardner-Webb.
- 8. Students must complete at least 120 total semester hours and meet all curriculum requirements in order to be eligible for graduation.
